

# tipsy rib scarf

## The Scarf of the Beast



I named this scarf “tipsy” because of the combination of the deep merlot-colored yarn and the diagonal rib that looks like it’s leaning just a bit to one side.

Then I realized that the finished product measured exactly 6x66 inches. Clearly, it is the devil’s own accessory.

Appropriate for all occasions, you can wear this simple scarf to séances, shopping malls, and church potlucks with equal aplomb.

### **MATERIALS:**

- 3 balls Artfibers Ming (50% silk, 50% merino; 143 yards; color #17) or other worsted-weight yarn
- 4.5mm (US 7) straight or circular needles

Cast on 36 stitches\*\*

- Rows 1 & 2:** k2, p2 across all 36 stitches  
**Row 3:** k1. \*p2, k2\* until 3 stitches from the end. p2, k1  
**Row 4:** p1. \*k2, p2\* until 3 stitches from the end. k2, p1  
**Row 5:** p2, k2 across all 36 stitches  
**Row 6:** Repeat Row 5  
**Row 7:** Repeat Row 4  
**Row 8:** Repeat Row 3

Repeat these 8 rows until the scarf reaches 66 inches or desired length.

\*\* to change the scarf’s width, cast on fewer or more stitches in multiples of 4
